HOLIDAY YOUTH CATCH PROGRAM

From **26th August - 2nd September 2024**, 38 Youths participated in a Youth Catch up Training. Under the theme: **(Knowing our times and seasons)**. A total of (33/68 who attended participated in Spiritual Activities, Physical aspect, social emotional activities, cognitive aspect and skilling.

These activities were aimed equipping Sunrise youths with knowledge and skills for self-sustainability, Self-awareness and building their self Esteem. & confidence. Different facilitators were used in the different fields of discipline for example The law enforcement team from Namugooona police, Health ministry from Jubilee Health services, Education and leadership skills from one of the sunrise child no. 778- Namukwaya Peninnah, Spiritual nurture was conducted by former sunrise child Head teacher Phillip Bumba – Kings Junior School. Training was both informative and experimental. Awareness training sessions and Practical hands - on skills were conducted in the academic field, Health, Legal and Economic Entrepreneurship related fields as follows.

Academic Sensitization,

This was conducted by Julius who Briefed the youths in senior three's (S.3) on how to choose the basic optional subjects of their choices regarding on their future careers or Professions. He guided them on how to balance paper and what it takes to for one to score highly. He encouraged them to concentrate and put more efforts on core subjects so that they can thrive and gave hope to the children to also put emphasis on vocational skills luckily enough it is a core part in their curriculum They were inspired to learn how to integrate project work with theoretical applications. A practical session of question approach was practically conducted with the students. Youths were given reference sites of research for sample questions.

Sexual related education.

KC AID staff recognizes that our youth (adolescents) face a range of sexual related challenges. For many youth; their caretakers are usually shy to share sexual related issues in details.

The youth therefore, Lack of adequate knowledge for protection which places them at risk of unwanted pregnancy, unsafe abortions and contraction of sexually transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS. It was evident as some of the participants asked "Can sexually transmitted diseases be treated?" "Can a Virgin get pregnant?"

This session sought to enlighten students most of whom were adolescents on the respectful and positive approaches towards handling development and growth.

The youth were sensitized on causes of spread and mechanisms prevention for sexually transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS.

At the end of session, Children obtained knowledge and life skills that are age appropriate, culturally and regularly sensitive to enable them make safe and healthy life choices.

Crime Prevention and Lawful Behavior/ Drug/Substance Abuse

Fostering a culture of discipline and lawfulness is one of KC AID priorities both at school and in the communities during the holiday Program our youths were sensitized on Drug abuse and Crime Prevention, this was conducted by area Police officer and Facilitator from Costa Uganda. This was aimed at equipping our youths with basic knowledge to make informed decisions to avoid crimes and drug abuse.

Tailoring & Knitting Training.

KC AID seeks to provide youth with entrepreneurship skills as an integral part of their education to improve livelihood. This is done through enrolment to vocational training school, apprenticeship, and other educational programs that teach practical job skills. On addition we provide tool kits for self-employment and financial support to enable the Youth establish Income Generating Activities.

We are glad that Knowledge on sewing and tailoring was prompted, creativity enhanced and economic potential advanced. This will culminate into an occupation when interested learners continue to participate in the training sessions.

The health screening activity was aimed at promoting self-awareness about health and choosing good health practices by our youths.
